

Tracking Money and Influence

Donald Trump's inauguration fueled by tobacco, oil and drug company money



- Trump's inaugural committee didn't have to file reports disclosing contributors until April.
- Using <u>lobbying contribution reports</u>, we were able to get an early peek at some large corporate contributors nearly three months earlier. (Here's an <u>example</u> of what the reports look like).
- It's important to know what contributors have to disclose, when they have to disclose it, and who they have to disclose it to.

Comeback for 'legalized money laundering' in party politics?




- Careful reading of campaign finance reports can make it possible to track money transferred from one committee to another.
- If you're reading filings regularly, you'll have an easier time understanding them and spotting the interesting ones.

This Form 99 is being submitted along with an amendment to the Amended October Monthly Report.

- 1.The increase in receipts and disbursements both totaling \$157,724.07 were related to Trump Victory JFC receipts and disbursements. These were handled in a separate JFC account and inadvertently left off the original filing. The committee subsequently amended its October Monthly Report to reflect the payout from the Trump Victory JFC and the accompanying disbursement to the Republican National Committee.
- 2. The year-to-date total calculations have been corrected on schedule H4.
- 3.The two disbursements in schedule H4 that had been missing expense descriptions have been added. "Advantage Direct? now has the corresponding purpose of "Auto Calls Not FEA?. "Adesys Consulting? now has the purpose of "Website Hosting?.
